2025 Legislative Session – June Update

The legislature is in the final days of session, with a hard deadline to adjourn by June 29. At this point in session, legislators are making final policy and budget decisions while negotiating controversial funding packages for transportation and wildfire. Here's what to expect relating to the Lottery.

Appropriating Future Lottery Revenue

<u>SB 5530</u> is the omnibus lottery appropriations bill. Once finalized, this bill appropriates most of the revenue Lottery is expected to generate for the 2025-27 biennium. Historically, this bill doesn't move until the final days (or hours!) of the session. When completed, it will show how much Lottery revenue will go to schools, state parks, veterans' services, economic development, and other beneficiaries over the next two years.

Authorizing the Sale of Lottery-Backed Revenue Bonds

As mentioned in the last update, <u>SB 5531</u> will authorize the sale of about \$500 million (exact amount yet to be determined) in Lottery-backed revenue bonds, the proceeds of which will fund projects in communities around the state. Like the omnibus lottery appropriations bill mentioned above, this bill won't be finalized until the end of session, at which time it will list the projects the Legislature has approved to be funded in whole or in part with proceeds from the sale of lottery-backed revenue bonds.

End-of-Session Action Report

After session adjourns at the end of June, Lottery will create an end-of-session report to explain what compliance actions Lottery will need to take to come into compliance with the new laws passed during the legislative session. More to come on that in July. In the meantime, the latest status update on bills Lottery is tracking is enclosed for reference.
