2025 Legislative Session – May Update

The legislature is now in the final weeks of session, with a plan to adjourn at the end of June. This memo provides an update on legislative activities relating to the Lottery.

“Discounting” and Winner Anonymity Bill Signed into Law

[HB 3115](#) has been signed into law and will take effect at the end of September. The bill prohibits the purchase or sale of winning Lottery tickets; prohibits the deduction of the price paid for a winning lottery ticket as a deduction for purposes of Oregon income tax; and prohibits the disclosure of a Lottery winner’s name and address.

To prepare to implement the bill, Lottery has formed a cross-department workgroup. Implementation activities include communicating with known “discounters” (people who routinely purchase winning tickets at a discount) about the new law; adopting rules and processes to identify illegally purchased tickets and deny prize payment; and updating rules, forms, and practices around disclosing or publicizing information about prize winners.

We’ll update the Commission this summer on rule changes that will be needed to implement HB 3115.

Legislature Passes New Law About Lottery Billboard Advertising

As discussed previously, [SB 914](#) would require Lottery to print a statement about the problem gambling helpline on any future billboard advertisements. This bill has now passed the House and Senate and heads to the Governor for signature. Lottery reported no fiscal impact to the bill.

May Economic and Revenue Forecast

State economists presented the May Economic and Revenue Forecast to lawmakers, reporting that the state has [less revenue available](#) for the 25-27 biennium than previously expected. To watch the presentation, click [here](#). You can read the full revenue forecast [here](#).

The Lottery revenue forecast was adjusted down due to lower Video Lottery sales than predicted but with higher traditional sales. Overall, for the current 2023-25 biennium, Lottery resources are lowered by \$10.5 million, with future biennia seeing more significant decreases of \$50-94 million. To read the

economist discussion of Lottery revenue, see [page 26 of the forecast](#). Lottery is still expected to provide close to \$1.9 billion in resources for the 25-27 biennium. (See [Table B.9, Lottery Resources](#).)

The release of this forecast allows budget writers to finalize the state budget for the 25-27 biennium, clearing the path to adjournment in June.

Lottery Funding for Local Community Projects

The Legislature held public hearings on [HB 5531](#), which authorizes the sale of ~\$500 million in Lottery-backed revenue bonds to fund community development projects. [Hundreds of people advocated](#) for projects like community centers, public swimming pools, hospital upgrades, early learning and childcare programs, and public safety investments. The committee will announce approved projects in June.

Bills of Interest to the Lottery
